FERC Data Request:

On July 22, 2020, Commission Staff issued a data request stating that WBI Energy did not appear to have taken into account the deductibility of state income taxes from federal income taxes when it calculated its total effective tax rate, as shown on Schedule 3 of Exhibit P of its application. In that data request, Staff asked WBI Energy to explain why it did not take this into account and to provide a revised incremental cost of service and incremental rate.

On July 28, 2020, WBI Energy responded to the data request, stating that its combined tax rate of 25.50% does take into account the deductibility of state income taxes from federal income taxes. WBI Energy provided the following formula in support of its answer:

5.5% combined state income tax rate - $(5.5\% \times 21\%) = 4.5\%$ effective state income tax rate. 21% federal rate + 4.5% effective state income tax rate = 25.50% combined effective federal and state income tax rate.

Please clarify or provide further detail on this arithmetic, specifically how the 4.5% effective state income tax rate was derived.

WBI Energy Response:

WBI Energy's combined effective federal and state income tax rate of 25.50% takes into account the deductibility of state income taxes from federal income taxes.

Calculation to account for deductibility of state income taxes from federal taxes is as follows:

$$5.5\% - (21\%*5.5\%) = 4.345\%$$

where 5.5% is equal to the combined state income tax rate and 21% is equal to the federal income tax rate. WBI Energy has rounded the resulting percentage to 4.5%.

The combined effective federal and state income rate is then:

$$21\% + 4.5\% = 25.5\%$$
