Re: WBI Energy Transmission, Inc. Wahpeton Expansion Project Docket No. CP22-466-000

Variance Request for Project Mitigation Measure Modification

Dear Acting Secretary Reese:

On October 23, 2023, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC or Commission) issued an Order Issuing Certificate (Order) in the above referenced docket authorizing WBI Energy Transmission, Inc. (WBI Energy) to construct, modify, operate, and maintain its Wahpeton Expansion Project (Project) in Cass and Richland Counties, North Dakota. On February 13, 2024, the Commission authorized WBI Energy to proceed with construction of all Project facilities.

Pursuant to Environmental Condition No. 1 of the Order, WBI Energy is hereby submitting a variance request to modify the procedures outlined in WBI Energy's application, Appendix 4G – Plan for Unanticipated Discovery of Historic Properties or Human Remains During Construction (Unanticipated Discovery Plan)¹ as they relate to a historic artifact scatter site (Site 32RI907) in the Project area. On July 9 and 11, 2024, four distinct unanticipated discoveries (UD001 – UD004) associated with Site 32RI907 occurred within the Project construction right-of-way², resulting in the expansion of the site boundary across the temporary and permanent Project right-of-way. In an email dated July 26, 2024, the State Historical Society of North Dakota (ND SHPO) agreed that UD001 did not significantly contribute to the overall research potential of Site 32RI907 and that the other unanticipated discoveries were ineligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. The FERC granted approval to proceed through these areas in an email dated July 26, 2024³.

Due to the likelihood that additional finds scattered from Site 32RI907 occur within the Project right-of-way, WBI Energy is requesting to modify the procedures in Section 4.0 – Discovery of

Cultural Materials of the Unanticipated Discovery Plan for Site 32RI907⁴ to avoid future Project construction delays resulting from further finds associated with the site. The modified approach, as outlined and approved by the ND SHPO on August 7, 2024, is described below. Attachment A contains the correspondence with ND SHPO.

- Future finds of any cultural material will be analyzed on a case-by-case basis.
- Future finds of surface artifacts, barring any of an unusual or unique nature, will be considered to be not significant, and will have no effect on project activities.
- Future finds of subsurface artifacts, in aggregations no greater than 10 in number within a 50-square-meter area, barring any of an unusual or unique nature, will be considered to be not significant, and will have no effect on project activities.
- Future finds of any subsurface features will result in the immediate stoppage of work activities, pending notification of the ND SHPO, and analysis of the find.

WBI Energy will continue to implement the procedures in the Unanticipated Discovery Plan should additional unanticipated discoveries not associated with Site 32RI907 occur.

WBI Energy respectfully requests written authorization from the Director of the Office of Energy Projects to utilize the requested Unanticipated Discoveries Plan modification, by Wednesday, August 14, 2024.

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Hi, Andrew

In your email of Friday, July 26, 2024, to Robbyn Reukauf of WBI Energy, you indicated that you concurred that the portions of 32RI907 crossed by their project were not significant to the site, and that construction could proceed. You further stipulated that if additional materials or features were observed, further work may be requested. In order to be able to advise our client appropriately so that they will be able to move forward with their project in the most efficient manner possible, we would like to get clarification concerning the nature of any future finds that would require further investigation.

In our previous experience with various state and Federal agencies involving cultural resources, typically once a site or portion thereof has been declared not significant, and therefore ineligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places, no further regard is given to any additional finds. We understand, however, that there is the potential for previously-unknown significant finds to be discovered during the construction phase of any project. We proposed to address any further finds with respect to 32RI907 as follows:

• Future finds of any cultural material will be analyzed on a case-by-case basis

- Future finds of surface artifacts, barring any of an unusual or unique nature, will be considered to be not significant, and will have no effect on project activities
- Future finds of subsurface artifacts, in aggregations no greater than 10 in number within a 50-square-meter area, barring any of an unusual or unique nature, will be considered to be not significant, and will have no effect on project activities
- Future finds of any subsurface features will be analyzed for content and nature, and, barring any attributes of an unusual or unique nature, will be considered to be not significant, and will have no effect on project activities

ERM will ensure that an SOI-qualified archaeologist views images of the find before providing authorization to proceed per outlined above, but not anticipate creating a new report for review.

We look forward to your response, so that we may communicate our plan to the FERC for approval should any additional finds occur within the specified portion of the site area.
